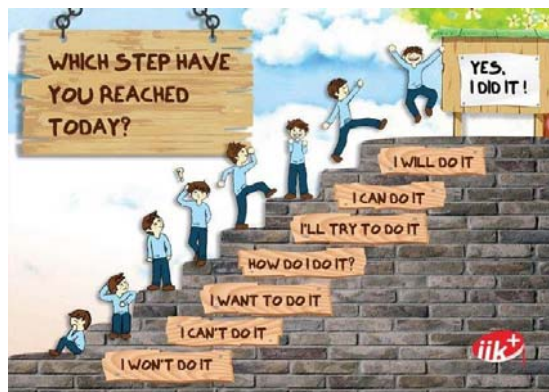

Students learn best when they have a Growth Mindset rather than a Fixed Mindset.



Fixed vs Growth

ability is static

- avoids challenges
- gives up easily
- sees effort as fruitless
- ignores useful criticism
- threatened by others

ability is developed

- embraces challenges
- persists in obstacles
- sees effort as necessary
- learns from criticism
- inspired by others' success

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HIGH EXPECTATIONS

At Reynella Primary School, we believe high expectations are the greatest form of respect that we can offer our students. High expectations indicate to learners that we believe in them. We believe they can rise to new challenges, standards and goals. We hold students to high expectations in all areas of learning. Whether it be academic learning, social and emotional learning or behavioural learning, we want our students to experience the reward (and challenge) of continual self-improvement. Of course, we do not expect people to succeed in every facet of their learning without first failing, persevering and receiving support or feedback. However, it is important that in these moments, more than ever, that our expectations are not lowered. This would be to say that 'we don't think you can do it' or 'maybe this just isn't for you.' These messages conflict with everything we know about the brain's capacity for learning.

As we move into the second half of the year it is important that we remind students of the high expectations we have for them. Our **whole school agreements** of safety, mutual respect, attentive listening and personal best are critical to creating the positive learning environment that we share. When learners waiver from these agreements, it is our responsibility to hold strong on our expectations and uphold an environment that supports successful learning for all. It has been amazing to see so many students surpassing all kinds of learning goals in terms one and two; we hope to see these efforts continue throughout the end of the year.

BONNE FÊTE

On Wednesday, week 6 (29 August) we are celebrating Bonne Fête, which is a French saying used to describe a celebration! Students can dress in clothes associated with French culture, or the French colours (blue, white and red) for a gold coin donation, which will help pay for supplies needed for the day.
